

Regular Meeting October 6, 2014 at Livingston City Hall at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Curtis Hayes called the meeting to order.

Cindy Robbins made the motion to accept the minutes as handed out. Bill Linder seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Greg McDonald representing the Downtown Revitalization Committee, presented bills in the amount of \$40,176.09. The bills were as follow:

- a. Greg McDonald – \$380.63 (reimbursement for TDEC grant meeting in Nashville)
- b. Town of Livingston – \$384.41 for receptacles for metal poles for lighted snowflakes
- c. Merchants Association - \$12,000.00 for New LED Lights for businesses around the square,
- d. BWSC - \$26,627.82 for final design for the Central Park parking lot and park concepts
- e. Town of Livingston – reim. of \$633.23 for ads bidding the Central Parking lot and the courthouse lawn
- f. UC Sign Services – \$150.00 for 6-2x2 signs for Central Parking Lot project

Cindy Robbins made the motion to approve the expenditures being paid out of the Downtown Revitalization funds. David Sadler seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes 0 no.

Mr. Brian Stone speaking on behalf of NORESCO stated that his company specializes in infrastructure improvement in energy savings with capital needs. After discussion, Mayor Hayes suggested that a work session with Mr. Brian Stone be set up at a later date.

Joel Parks, CMFO for the Town of Livingston read letters from the State of Tennessee, Comptroller of the Treasury Office. The letter acknowledges receipt of a certified copy of the 2015 fiscal year budget for the Town of Livingston. (The letters are retained in the minutes.)

Mayor Curtis Hayes presented an estimate to place guard rails along Rock Crusher Mountain. The estimate was in the amount of \$10,150.00 from Cumberland Guardrail Inc. The estimate was per TDOT specs for material and labor only.

After discussion, Mayor Hayes proposed to put the guardrails in the 2016 budget.

Roy Wauford of J. R. Wauford and Company presented tabulation of bids received for the 700 HP pump and motor. The low bidder was Guthrie Sales & Service: Fairbanks (\$229,661). According to Mr. Wauford, delivery will be in 33 weeks.

Mayor Hayes presented Resolution # 2014-10-01 (Resolution awarding contract to Gutherie Sales and Service and authorizing J. R. Wauford & Co. to prepare specification for upgrade of the electrical equipment of raw water intake.

David Langford expressed his concerns that the loan is for 20 years, he would like to pay it off sooner. Joel Parks made the recommendation to make a commitment to pay off sooner. Mayor Hayes suggested putting the monies in as a line item in the 2015 budget.

Bill Winningham made the motion to adopt Resolution 2014-10-1. David Langford seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

John Meadows had presented the Aldermen with a letter concerning the Harold Brown/Doug Clark de-annexation request. He asked if there were any questions. There were no questions.

Fire Chief Rocky Dial recommended that Tim Porter be hired to fill the position vacated by Steve Wright.

Lynn King made the motion to hire Tim Porter. Bill Linder seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Fire Chief Rocky Dial stated that after inspecting the vehicle from Chicago Motors, approved by the Board of Alderman in the previous meeting, he had chosen not to purchase the vehicle.

He presented specs for another vehicle, but upon recommendation from Attorney John Meadows, according to the law, it must be re-bid.

Bill Linder made the motion to adjourn. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes 0 no.
