

Regular Meeting November 3, 2014 at Livingston City Hall at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Curtis Hayes called the meeting to order.

Cindy Robbins made the motion to accept the minutes as handed out. David Langford seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Greg McDonald representing the Downtown Revitalization Committee, presented bills in the amount of \$7116.50. The bills were as follow:

David Langford made the motion to approve the bills being paid for out of Downtown Revitalization funds. Bill Linder seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Greg McDonald also reported that there is a potential of new businesses coming into Overton County.

Police Chief Greg Etheredge recommended that Andrew Neff and Jeremy Laycock be hired as police officers. He also requested that Bruce Matthews’s salary be increased to \$12.02 per hour.

Lynn King made the motion to approve the hiring of Andrew Neff and Jeremy Laycock as police officers and for Bruce Matthews’s hourly rate of pay be changed to \$12.02. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Charlie Smith of BWS&C presented Engineering Agreement # 3 (Design Services for Central Park – not to exceed \$91,000. 00 and Engineering Agreement #4 (New Downtown Crosswalks and Sidewalks to Central Park – not to exceed \$39,000.00).

Bill Winningham made the motion to approve Engineering Agreement # 3 and Agreement #4. David Sadler seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Greg Davenport of J. R. Wauford & Company gave an update on the raw water intake. They hope to have the new pump installed by January or February.

Alderman Robbins ask where we were on labeling the city vehicles.

Mayor stated that some of the vehicles are already marked and others are in the process of being marked.

Alderman Langford stated that he did not feel that this matter had been taken seriously.

It was discussed that they wanted the supervisor's vehicles labeled with their names and titles and that the names and unit number be put on patrol cars. They would like **all vehicles** marked.

Police Chief Etheredge stated that uncover vehicles need to remain unmarked for investigative purposes.

Alderman Langford stated that all vehicles need to be marked and that anything that leaves the city needs to be labeled.

It was noted that in a previous meeting that the agreement was to leave 5 unmarked cars (Police Chief, Captain and 3 detectives).

Lynn King made the motion to adjourn. Bill Winningham seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.
