

Regular Meeting December 1, 2014 at Livingston City Hall at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Curtis Hayes called the meeting to order.

Bill Linder made the motion to accept the minutes as handed out. David Sadler seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.

Greg McDonald, representing the Downtown Revitalization Committee, presented the following bills in the amount of \$21,868.97.

c. City of Livingston (reim. on bills)	2,272.78
d. Penny's Precise	158.78

After discussion on the progress of the construction project, David Sadler made the motion to approve the bills being paid out of downtown revitalization funds. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.

Mr. McDonald also gave a report on area businesses that may be hiring in the near future because of growth in their business.

David Langford made the motion to approve the \$500.00 donation to the Christmas Parade committee. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.

Mr. Larry Gunnels was present to give a report on the restoration of the American Legion building. They have received a grant to help with the restoration of this building.

Police Chief Greg Etheredge stated that the police department is ready to sell some surplus equipment on Gov.Deals. He stated that some of the items to be sold will be a bulldozer, tractor, wood chipper, etc.

David Sadler made the motion to approve the selling of the equipment on Gov.Deals. Bill Linder seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.

Airport Chairman Johnny Halfacre gave an update on the airport. They have received a grant for the sealing and stripping of the runway. He stated that they have a waiting list for T-Hangars.

Airport Chairman Halfacre stated that the FBO contract with James Sells is up in February 2015. He would like to recommend that this contract be extended for 1 year with 1 year option. The city attorney will have to draw up the contract and the contract will have to be signed by the Mayor and County Executive.

Cindy Robbins made the motion to extend the contract 1 year with a 1 year option. Bill Winningham seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.

Alderman Robbins ask for an update on the labeling of the vehicles. Police Chief Etheredge stated that he lacked 3 being labeled but they should be labeled this week. Mayor Hayes stated that all the other departments had their vehicles labeled.

Bill Winningham made the motion to adjourn. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.
