

Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Alderman on June 2, 2014 at 6:00 p.m. at Livingston City Hall.

Mayor Curtis Hayes called the meeting to order.

David Langford made the motion to accept the minutes as handed out. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.

Greg McDonald representing the Downtown Revitalization Committee presented bills in the amount of \$14,777.44

Chief Etheredge stated that he thought the cameras would be a help in solving crimes and/or accidents around the square.

It was stated that you will eventually be able to go to the website to see what is happening on the square.

After discussion, David Langford made the motion to approve the expenditures out of the Downtown Revitalization fund. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.

Zac Littrell of Atmos Energy was present to give an update on the Natural Gas market.

Chief Greg Etheredge and SRO Sean Allred were present to ask that the 30 mph school zone speed limit be extended to Airport Road and the Emergency Management Service. Officer Allred stated that he thought this would be safer for the students and the officers working the school zone.

Bill Linder made the motion to extend the 30 mph school zone to the Airport Road and the Emergency Management Services. Bill Winningham seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.

It was also discussed about having officers work the school zone on Celina Hwy. in the afternoon.

George Haliford of Highlands Initiative gave a brief overview of what the Highlands was working on for the region.

Dennis Smith and Lavonna Smith of Air Evac presented a plan where Overton County residents would have Air Medical transport service available. It is estimated that the cost of a medical flight would be approximately \$25,000.00 per flight. Some insurance companies pay up to 50% of the cost. If the city decided to go with this plan it would cost \$22,771.00.

The Board took this matter under advisement.

Darius Sims reported that the Farmers Market will be accepting EBT payments. Customers can purchase \$1.00 tokens at City Hall.

Police Chief Greg Etheredge recommended that Justin Bowman be hired as dispatcher. He is a resident of Overton County.

David Sadler made the motion to approve the hiring of Justin Bowman as dispatcher. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.

The Board discussed the status of the paving project.

The Board discussed the water problem on Zachery Street. It was stated that the engineer was still working on this situation.

Bill Linder made the motion to adjourn. Bill Winningham seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes and 0 no.
