

Regular Meeting August 4, 2014 at Livingston City Hall at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Curtis Hayes called the meeting to order.

Bill Linder made the motion to accept the minutes as handed out. David Langford seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Greg McDonald representing the Downtown Revitalization Committee presented bills in the amount of \$30,998.87.

After a few questions on the bills, Lynn King made the motion to approve the bills being paid for out of Downtown Revitalization funds. David Sadler seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

The Board decided to take the Storm Water Ordinance until advisement. They will meet with the Planning Commission on August 25<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m. to discuss the ordinance.

Richard Brooks, representing Harold Brown and Malcolm Douglas Clark II, ask the Board to consider de-annexing their property that had been annexed into the city limits in 2004. He stated that some of the services had not been provided to the residents. For this reason, he was asking that the city de-annex the area. He stated that this de-annexation could be put on the November ballot so the residents could decide if they wanted to be de-annexed.

Mayor Hayes stated that City Attorney John Meadows will work on this matter and get back to Mr. Brooks within 60 days.

Mayor Hayes stated that there would be a Work Session with Warren Nevad of MTAS on August 18, 2014 at 6:00 p.m.

John McLeod was present to commend the City for having a nice park for the kids in the area.

Rick Winningham requested permission to have a 5K run the last of September or first of October. There would also be a singing on the square.

The Board approved the 5K run.

Alderman Langford stated that a manhole on Reeser Street needs a cover.

The Board discussed the labeling of all city vehicles and equipment. The Board would like a log of all the equipment and vehicles. This log needs to include the department and unit number.

After discussion, David Sadler made the motion to label all equipment and vehicles with the exception of 5 unmarked cars. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Alderman Bill Linder suggested that the city take another look at the sign ordinance. He had some complaints that the enforcing of the ordinance had not been fair.

The Board will have a work session with the Planning Commission on August 11<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m. to discuss the sign ordinance.

Cindy Robbins made the motion to adjourn. Bill Linder seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.
