

Regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Alderman on May 4, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. at Livingston City Hall.

Mayor Curtis Hayes called the meeting to order.

Bill Linder made the motion to accept the minutes as handed out. David Langford seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Mayor Hayes stated that Livingston Housing Authority had requested that speed bumps be installed on Hi-Tech Drive.

After discussion, the Board decided to take this under advisement until a study could be conducted.

Mayor Hayes read a letter from the Livingston Civic and Garden club concerning the memorative bricks on the square. The Civic and Garden Club started this project years ago. They ask that they be the only organization that could place memorative bricks on the square.

David Sadler made the motion that the Livingston Civic and Garden Club is the only organization that can place memorative bricks around the square. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

The Board discussed the borrowing 1.1 million dollars for Central Park Project. The loan will be paid off using the Downtown Revitalization funds that are received from the state.

Cindy Robbins made the motion to approve borrowing 1.1 Million Dollars for the Central Park Project and to use the Downtown Revitalization funds to pay for the loan. Lynn King seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

David Langford made the motion to borrow the money from the Tennessee Municipal Bond Fund. Bill Linder seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Downtown Revitalization Committee Chairman Budd Bishop stated that they appreciate the city's support for Central Park project.

Police Chief Etheredge stated that some of the surplus property was ready to be put on Gov Deals.

Lynn King made the motion for the surplus property to be put on Gov.Deals. David Sadler seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Mayor Hayes stated that the equipment from the Street and Water Dept. would be sold at the City Auction on May 28th.

David Sadler made the motion to have the city auction on May 28th. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Alderman Robbins stated that several people had ask if the auction would be held later in the day.

Mayor Hayes stated that the auction was normally held at noon.

David Sadler made the motion to have the auction at noon. Bill Winningham seconded the motion. The vote was 5 yes with Cindy Robbins voting no.

Water Supt. Tim Coffee stated the meter reader Johnny Harris would be retiring at the end of June and that he recommended that Joseph Sweezy be hired to replace Johnny Harris.

It was stated that Johnny Harris had done an excellent job as meter reader.

Lynn King made the motion to hire Joseph Sweezy. Bill Winningham seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Police Chief Greg Etheredge recommended that Tracy Dishman be hired as dispatcher. She has 7 years experience with the sheriff's department.

David Sadler made the motion to hire Tracy Dishman as dispatcher. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Cindy Robbins made the motion to adjourn. Bill Winningham seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.
