

Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Alderman on September 8, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. at Livingston City Hall.

Mayor Curtis Hayes called the meeting to order.

David Sadler made the motion to accept the minutes as handed out. Bill Linder seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Greg McDonald, representing the Downtown Revitalization Committee, presented the following bills to be paid out of Downtown Revitalization funds.

Better Lawns	\$1645.00
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Bill Winningham made the motion to approve the bills in the amount of \$1645.00 being paid out of Downtown Revitalization Funds. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Megan Farris of UCDD gave an update on the Central Park project.

Roy Wauford, Greg Davenport and Kevin Young of J. R. Wauford and Company were present to give an updated on the Water Plant Project and Sewer Plant issues.

James Talley of Hannah Solar and Warren Nevad gave a brief overview of the solar energy proposal that had been presented earlier at the work session.

After discussion, the Board decided to take this matter under advisement until the October 5, 2015 meeting.

Tom Weir was present to discuss purchasing an undeveloped alley located on S. Church Street. This alley is located between his property and the Millard Vaughn Oakley Library.

They have talked with County Executive Ben Danner and there is no problem with Mr. Weir purchasing this alley.

It was noted that the Town's water, sewer and gas lines are in this alley.

Mr. Weir stated that he had no problem with giving the Town utility easements for this property.

David Sadler made the motion to sell the undeveloped alley to Mr. Weir provided the town has a utility easement. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

David Langford made the motion to hire Kenny Smith as mechanic at City Garage. Cindy Robbins seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Mayor Hayes stated the city had ordered 300 tons of salt from Morton Salt at \$89.61 per ton. The price is up from last year.

Bill Linder made the motion to approve the purchase of 300 tons of salt in the amount of \$26,800.00. David Sadler seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Fire Chief Rocky Dial reported that there is a TML Driver Safety Grant that the city can apply for. The grant is 50/50 grant. The city would have to pay \$1000.00 if they receive the grant. He stated that they would like to apply for some back up cameras for the vehicles and that all departments would be using them.

David Langford made the motion to apply for the grant. Lynn King seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.

Alderman Langford and Alderman Sadler stated that the organizers had contacted them about the Walk for Jesus that will be held on Saturday, October 3, 2015. The only change from last year will be that they will be located on the west side of the square instead of the east side.

Alderman Winningham stated that he had received a complaint on that there was a problem where the stop sign was put on Rock Crusher Road. Alderman Langford stated that he had been told that there is a problem coming to a dead stop with cattle trailer.

No action was taken on this matter.

Cindy Robbins made the motion to adjourn. Bill Linder seconded the motion. The vote was 6 yes and 0 no.
